

Annual Progress Report

(Financial Year 2024-2025)

Annual General Meeting:

The annual general meeting of the board of trustees was held at its registered office on 30-04-2025 . All the trustees were present in the meeting and thus the quorum was fulfilled the meeting was presided over by the President Smt. Kirti Mundra and addressed by the Secretary Mis Monika Srivastava of the board of trust.

Addressing the meeting, the Secretary Miss Monika Srivastava told that during the financial year between 01-04-2023 to 31-03-2024, the trust had carried out various welfare schemes. Like Woman Awareness Program, Voter Awareness Program, Free education to poor student, Dowry abolition awareness Program, Health Awareness Program, National festival Program, Environment Awareness Program, Water save awareness camp, Bhoj Bhandara (Food distribution to poor public and students), Puls Polio Awareness Program, Cyber crime Awareness Program etc. These activities were performed in rural, semi- urban and urban areas of district Mirzapur. The programs were successful and the beneficiaries were men, women, students, unhealthy, disabled and old age persons in addition to this rejected of the trust.

1. **Woman Awareness Program** : The program provided information to women about domestic violence, child marriage, dowry, women's protection laws, and government welfare schemes. Health-related topics such as nutrition, sanitation, and maternal and child health were also discussed. Women were informed about self-employment, skill development, digital literacy, and financial management to empower them economically.
2. **Voter Awareness Program** : In Aamghat, Devari, rural arias and city arias in district Mirzapur, the voters were made aware by giving them information about their right to vote.

4. **Dowry abolition Awareness Program** : Both giving and receiving dowry give rise to crime. This is a wicked practice that must be eradicated from society. An awareness campaign was launched to raise awareness about this issue, which was widely discussed throughout the city.
5. **Health Awareness Program** : Under this program health activities were organized at community level in villages (Barkaccha, Pahadi, shahpur, Kotwa) in Mirzapur district. Through lectures, basic information on different health topics, including the health benefits or threats we face, were provided to the small groups of audience. It was very useful to the audience, as they reported their views to our staff and volunteers. So, we can say that is was successful.

6. **National festival Program** : All the members of the organization together celebrated the national festivals on 15 August 2024 and 26 January 2025 with great enthusiasm.
7. **Environment Awareness Program** : To protect the environment, awareness campaigns were launched in cities and villages. In this campaign, people were informed about the rising temperatures during the summer and the trees being cut down. They were also made aware of the need to protect trees and plant more trees.
8. **Water save awareness Program** : A campaign was launched in Mirzapur city and villages to raise awareness among citizens about the importance of conserving clean drinking water. They were informed about potential future water crises and encouraged to take preventive measures. They also provided tips on how to conserve rainwater. This campaign was widely appreciated.
9. **Bhoj Bhandara (Food distribution to poor public and students)** : The organization periodically organized food distribution programs for the poor and hungry, which many people benefited from. Food was also provided from time to time for poor students, benefiting both the hungry, poor children, the elderly, and the young.
10. **Puls Polio Awareness Program** : In view of the increasing malnutrition among children, the organization launched a campaign in the city to make people aware about Pulse Polio.
11. **Cyber crime Awareness Program** : In light of the growing cybercrime in the country, an awareness campaign was launched in schools to raise awareness among children. The children were deeply affected and delighted to learn strategies to avoid such crimes. Parents and teachers also benefited from this program.
